The animals and ourselves are grateful we have had a cool summer so far. Local rehabs report biological clocks of all wildlife were off six weeks or more due to the wet, cold spring. The first part of June most of our animals were still in winter coat and nights dipped into the 40's. It has been an unbelievable year so far and makes us nervous as to what may be ahead for winter months. We were blessed with no flooding but

all the counties that surround us were devastated and declared disaster areas. Thousands of acres of crops were lost to floods and fuel costs are going to drive prices up on everything this winter for both

animals and humans. We have already been feeling a huge impact and a serious financial crunch due to the depressed economy. We are cutting corners where we can and struggling to make ends meet. Lately we find ourselves praying a lot for the planet, those affected by the elements and all the animals in our care and elsewhere. The future worries us but we will keep doing what we do, no matter what is headed our way, because we are survivors and have had many hard times before us throughout the years. Please pray

for us each day. God Bless each and everyone.

Sanctuary Update

We wanted to start construction projects several months ago but have been unable to, due to lack of volunteers and funds. Our construction base now consists of two volunteers each Saturday,

which is the only day we can do construction projects. We have very few volunteers during the weekdays and have to depend on paid service contract people to feed and water. Future projects will

have to be done by fencing professionals. We will have to hire them as the Sanctuary can afford and small projects will be for those volunteers we have available on Saturdays. These are different times we live in, price of gas, cost of living and economic conditions are preventing people from volunteer efforts. We have many things that need to be done and all of us have to be patient. Please help us, if you are able, with upcoming construction costs. All donations

are tax deductible; we receive no State or Federal funding. Steadily rising prices are killing us; the last fill on the diesel tank for the reefer and tractor was over \$2,000.00, which will last less than a month! The electricity each month averages \$1,500.00 or more and costs for grain, hay and shavings are expected to triple this winter. We have had large animal Veterinary costs in the thousands over the past several months for unexpected procedures and dental work on our hoofed stock. Our local animal veterinary clinic does not give us a break on services which are very expensive. The Sanctuary has been blessed with a steady meat supply and that should continue to keep our reefer and freezers stocked for the summer. Many facilities have closed doors over the past few years putting the burden on others like us to pick up the the pieces. We do what we can to help all species of animals, not just a select few, and we can't do it without wonderful members who truly are the reason we are able to do the work we do. It is hard to imagine

where the future will take any of us, but we pray things will turn around soon. We are receiving calls daily with people who have fallen on hard times, seeking homes for their animals. We have networked with many small rescue groups for dogs, cats and birds. We have been fortunate to find rescues that have room for a few horses and small hoofed stock we cannot take for later placement. We are all working together as one to help animals everywhere and it is overwhelming at times, but at the same time rewarding to find help for many displaced precious creatures.



Adobby is a young Bobcat who came from Madison, Wisconsin. His owner could no longer care for him and used him in educational pro-




all be housed together. Adobby is very handsome and red in color. He is also far smaller and

her. Heidi will be one of the first to greet others as new arrivals meet at Rainbow Bridge. The Universe could not have a better ambassador as she stands along side




ways eager to please and intertwine their soul within ours for all eternity. The grief process in losing a beloved domestic four legged family member is unexplainable. Any-
