all is upon us, can you believe it! This year seems to be passing with a blink of an eve. Much needs to be done with the fall rush to get things accomplished and we all are in winter mode. Never enough hours in the day and darkness falls earlier with each passing day. We are bracing for a brutal winter because of the bizarre weather patterns throughout the year. It is better to be over prepared than be at a loss in severe winter storms. Wind breaks, tarps, heated electric buckets in

place, hay put up and supplies filling every nook and cranny. Our needs at this time are blankets, heavy outdoor electrical cords, treated 1/2 and 3/4" plywood

and treated 2x4's. We are always in need of kitty litter, bleach, paper towels, bottled water, shavings, any type of grain, dog and cat food the year round. A list of our usual monthly needs is as follows: each and every month we go through 5,000 pounds of different grain, 200 bales of pine shavings that are 50 pounds each (we use for the big cats and hoofed stock), 600lbs of kitty litter, 750 lbs of dry dog and cat food for the wolf hybrids and small exotics, 300 small bales of hay, 80 pounds each (we use for the big cats and hoofed stock} and twenty, 1,200 lb round hay bales for the big feeders. The grain we use is cracked corn, soybean meal, senior and regular

horse omoline, gamebird and dove feed, Mazurri brand Wallaby and Emus maintenance feed, goat, pig, llama and camel grain, rabbit pellets with papaya, alfalfa pellets, rice bran, calf manna, horse supplements and mineral blocks. We have many animals on medications and also prescription diets. We use KD dog and cat canned and dry, WD canine canned and dry and ID dog dry and canned. These items are purchased each month and are rarely if ever donated. The list goes on and doesn't include other expenses like

electric, service contracts for workers, diesel, gas and meat we purchase each week for special needs animals or when we run

short for all the big cats. The economy has us pinched and going into winter is not a good time to be short of funds or needs. We receive absolutely no State or Federal funding and survive solely on donations to feed and house all the animals in our care. All donations are 100% tax deductible. Please help ease our burdens by making a difference in the lives of the animals today. Thank You from he bottom of our hearts and God Bless you all!

We are not a domestic animal shelter and are not licensed for dogs and cats. We have received rescue calls for domestic dogs and cats from as far away as Texas, Nebraska and Washington. People




are desperate and shelters are full all across the country. It breaks our hearts to hear of so many displaced animals but we have to stick to what we are licensed for and not risk the welfare of those in our care. Check with specific breed rescues or no-kill shelters locally and on the Internet. Many members are unaware we cannot take domestic dogs and cats so please spread the word, we would greatly appreciate it!

Sanctuary Update:

We have moved Misty the cougar up to the house to be with Boo Boo and so far all is well. Boo is thrilled to have a buddy and Misty is tolerating him well. Their rela-

tionship will take some time to blossom. Samson the lion, is now living in half of Kali's enclosure. We are waiting for the right time to put them together. So far, Kali is thrilled and thinks he is Togar and doesn't understand why she can't be with Samson. Samson on the other hand does not seem overjoyed at the prospect of having a friend and is very timid along the fence line with her. This relationship will take some time but we have high expectations for them to be introduced soon. Festus was moved to Misty's old enclosure by the wolf hybrids and his enclosure is being knocked down to be used for storage which we desperately need! The doves have been turned loose in the Peacock enclosure and are extremely happy. Their old area is being renovated for an extra room for Chaucer and Katia until we can afford to build them a new enclosure. Quite a few changes and more to come over the fall and winter months. We have been concentrating on giving the animals bigger and better areas and paring those who have lost Beloved friends.


