Since February of this year, someone has been fraudulently using our Valley of the Kings bank account for their own benefit. Our debit/ checking account has been methodically robbed of over \$3000.00 during a period of five months.

We are working with our bank and the authorities to find the source of the fraudulent use, but the likelihood of the thieves being caught is minimal, at best. Normally, we use checks to make large purchases, the debit card for smaller daily purchases. We can only hope our bank will reimburse all of our funds as we have fraud protection for this account. Please say a prayer that this problem will end soon.



Tiger, Tiger, burning bright

There are many tiger colors in the world and each and everyone of them is exquisite in there own right. Four separate colors of the

tiger dominate today. 1) The standard orange and white (blacked striped). 2) The Royal White (white with black stripes). 3) The Golden Tabby (Red to pale orange cream stripes and saddle). and 4) the Snow



Assam and **Jasmine** are Golden Tabbies and Oxanna is a Snow Tiger. They are very rare and all colors have occurred in the wild. There have also been reported colors of chocolate, gray, marbled, and black. One of the most recent sightings of a rare black tiger occurred in 1993 when a young female black tiger was killed just west of the Similipa Tiger Reserve near the village of Podagad, India. Another was killed near Kerala, India in the 1700's.

It is a sad testament to the human race when we have to kill something so very special and rare! Most scholars hold the theory that all tigers originated from Siberia and during the last Ice Age were forced to migrate south to warmer climates. Tiger territories went as far south as the island of Bali and as far west as the Caspian Sea.

Through the centuries, tigers be-

came smaller in size, the Balinese tiger was only 200 pounds! That's a tiny tiger! Tigers in the wild are

in captivity.

There are thousands of tigers in captivity and less than 1% of the original population still exists in the wild. The majority in captivity are inbred causing a multitude of problems from health ismental capacities.

We have seen some of it in our tigers as well as in many others throughout the country. Two of our very close friends were killed by their white tiger in Alachua, Florida in 1998, Joy Holiday and Chuck Lizza. The tiger that killed

them was severely inbred and had obvious mental issues. Jupiter was many as we have had through the a magnificent Royal White but had years but there will always be tia screw loose since the time he was little. He lost his life to the Alachua Police Dept. Swat Team. He never should have been allowed contact, beyond weaning, with anyone because of his mental issues. Our two friends would be alive today had they headed my warning so many years ago. It is heartbreaking and we miss them dearly. You can't change the past but you can learn from it and educate to "try" and prevent someone from making the same mistake. Tigers, by far, are some of the

most beautiful cats in the world. I have devoted my life to them over the past 36 years and they have severely endangered, but not those taught me a great deal by allowing me to be apart of there lives. Many of the cats that have lived in the house with us, and many others, have never been allowed to have hands-on contact. Each and every cat shares "cat" traits, but each also has his/her own personality as we humans do. They all have there own set of rules, level of awareness and safety zone. If you are not blessed with common sense, a bad cat can cost you your life. Many new Federal laws have sues to dangerous been passed and are being implemented affecting people who have



big cats, including sanctuaries, and they are being enforced to protect people as well as the animals.

We will always have tigers, not as gers at Valley of The Kings to educate and bring awareness to the plight of these beautiful cats world wide.

In Memory of Kumah January 26, 1989 - May 20, 2009

n May 20th our littlest bear, Kumah, died suddenly and was found in her feeding area. Her heart gave out like Yummie and it was a sad day at the Sanctuary. She was a special bear and her favorite treat to eat was fresh blueberries. She would sit and sift through her mountain of fresh fruit and veggies to get to the tiny berry's be-



low first. Her nose was jet black throughout her lifetime but changed to bright

over this past year. We have never seen this before in any of the other animals.

Kumah loved to scare people and charge the fence when she knew you didn't have treats for her. She was extremely intelligent but over the last 3 years had suffered with senility. She refused to use the big den with Vinnie and wanted to sleep outdoors in the elements year round. Volunteers built a house just for her, which she enjoyed destroying; but she did sleep in it. I can not tell you how many times the inside of her house was rebuilt!

Kumah was a purebred black bear and came from an exotic animal sale in Black River Falls, Wisconsin. When Kumah was born she was pulled from her mother, bottle raised and then sent to the children's petting zoo in Madison, Wisconsin. She stayed there all summer and was then sent back to

the breeder in the fall. The breeder then put her through the sale we attended that fall. At that time there was a man on probation in Wisconsin for taking 200 black bear from the wild, killing them for gall bladders and body parts, then selling the parts on the black market. He resorted to purchasing bears at auctions and harvesting them legally on his farm by the hundreds. I saw him bidding on Kumah and jumped in on the bidding war. We paid \$300.00 to save a little bear that day and it was a decision I will always be grateful for. Kumah had a great life with us and lived a long happy, healthy life with her bear friends.

Vinnie remains old and alone but doesn't seem to mind. He understood immediately Kumah had crossed Rainbow Bridge and was okay with it. His days are coming to and end as he also is very old. Once Vinnie dies it will be the end of bears for VOTK. We will miss the bears when Vinnie is gone but as Jim and I grow older we have come to the realization we can't save them all.

Bears are also an enormous amount of work. For all the food that goes into a bear, it seems that ten times that amount comes out. The enclosure will eventually be torn down and a smaller cat housing will be put up for cougars, bobcat and lynx.

We hope Vinnie will be with us a few more years, but his heart like Yummie and Kumah's, could give out sooner instead of later. We will miss our little Kumah but find peace within out hearts to know she is with Yummie and both are

in a well deserved place. I can envision Kumah eating her beloved blueberries and Yummie munching on delicious artichokes she loved. Both bears loved grapes and would put one at a time on the back of their paw, then eat them one at a time. The bears also would take the tiny labels off fruit before they ate and put the stickers in a little pile. As often as we could, we would sit, amazed, and watch them delicately eat. We will all miss those moments. They were both great bears and we have thoroughly enjoyed them throughout the vears.
