
> > candle-lit ceremony for him afterward and more than thirty people who loved and knew this magnificent tiger came for his service. Each

burial. We buried Sammy with Farah, his mate of 27 years, side by side, his arm over her as they often slept while alive. On their headstone we had a bird of peace etched at the top in remembrance of that special dove waiting for an old tiger that day. We never saw that dove again and I envisioned that beautiful tan and white angelic spirit accompanied by angels escorting our beloved Sammy home over Rainbow Bridge. Our grief continued long beyond that day. Hearts longed to hug Sammy one last time, candles, notes and flowers adorned his grave constantly for many months afterward. Many would visit and light candles for Sammy and Farah and if ever an animal could be classified as a Saint, Sammy would be at leave his side the top of the list.

Time passed, seasons came and went and in the Spring of 2002 I had a very vivid vision during my sleep. I walked across the street into the tree nursery and followed a path. I told Sammy he would have to return and he said "I"m coming with you!" He kept saying that each time I told him he had to go back. When we reached the road I said "this is where we have to say goodbye Sammy" and hugged him tighter than ever before, never wanting to let that precious moment go. He adamantly said one last time "But I TOLD YOU, I'M COMING WITH YOU!"

In that instant, Sammy changed into a little white kitten and rubbed affectionately against my leg then leaped in my arms. He told me he was coming back and I would know it was him by two signs. I crossed the street with Sammy, now a kitten in my arms and then woke with tears still streaming down my cheeks. I told Jim Sammy was coming back as a domestic in the next few months and there would be signs so that

> we would know it was him. Jim and I were so excited because whenever I have a vision they always come to pass.

A few months later Dr Rudawski called to see if we would take a large breed, three month old puppy that was relinquished by the owner because of

bad knees. He had fixed one knee and the other would be done in two weeks. We agreed to take her sight unseen, as we had recently lost our farm dog to old age. When we went to pick her up I was completely blown away. As we locked eyes it was instant recognition for all of us! "Its you Sammy", I exclaimed! The puppy was all white, the first sign as Sammy presented himself as a white kitten. Her eyes were painted like wearing mascara just as Sammy's and she had his soft sweet eyes too. The puppy had an extra long tail with the same kink

Sammy had and when I picked her up she wrapped it around my waist like Sammy used to do. But the final sign was the big tan splotches on her body the same color shade of the dove that sat on his grave that day. When Sammy crossed over I told him not to come back as an exotic. I didn't mention domestic. Sammy always had a sense of humor and found a way to honor my wish yet still return to us; it was so like him.

We named the puppy Emily and she is much like Sammy in so many ways. She lives for people, has that soft quiet energy and nuzzles for treats and attention like Sammy always did. Sammy wanted to come back as a domestic so he could be with all the people who loved him. To visit and be hugged by each and every one, everyday. Brenda, who is now deceased, was one of our friends who did acupuncture and came three times a week toward the end of Sammy's life to help him. The first time Emily saw Brenda, she very quietly and gently jumped up and put her paws on Brenda's shoulders. Looking deep within her eyes and thanking Brenda for helping ease the pain in her last life. She did this each and every time she saw Brenda and never with anyone else to this day. Emily exhibits many large cat traits and has Sammy's personality. Always happy go lucky and has the sweetest energy. We are so grateful to have our Sammy

back and our sadness in losing him has been replaced by that beautiful tiger being Emily in this life.
