Disturbing News

We have been receiving e-mails and letters from people about the retail sales of Lion meat. Restaurants are selling Lion burgers for \$20.00 in Illinois and other states. This is not something new! It has been going on for many, many years and is an approved practice among collectors, with our Federal Government's stamp of approval. When lions and other exotics are raised, for profit, in captivity, you can do what ever you want with them. Greedy owners may part them out, sell the meat, hide and head for thousands of dollars. This goes on daily here in the

U.S. Endangered species are not exempt from slaughter if they are "captive raised". They are only endangered in the "Wild". Exotics are being shot and slaughtered for greed at an alarming rate! Last fall a lion head fell out of the back of a pickup truck in Marengo, Illinois. Our inspectors could not tell us where it came from, but only that it was harvested via "USDA standards". We have a letter signed personally from John Cuneo who owns the multi-million dollar Hawthorne Corporation in Libertyville, Illinois. The letter states that he sees nothing wrong with selling hides of big cats! He had supplied the majority of big cats and elephants to circuses before being shut down due to animal abuse charges and fined by USDA. Tuberculosis among animals and workers were discovered which cost some of the elephants their lives. He has harvested many big cats through out the years and continues to do so. Young exotics are purchased for pennies on the dollar at auctions throughout our country. Big cats are almost worthless alive, but dead they are priceless for parts and meat. At one particular auction in Cape Girardeau, Mo. a lion went through the sale with only a \$50.00 bid. The buyer took the animal out back, shot it, pelted it, then left it's carcass on the side of the road by the auction house. The crate that lion was transported in, went





No one wanted to take home that precious life and his fate was sealed the moment he was consigned to the auction. These stories are heartbreaking but ones that need to be heard. I have held a big cats paw in comfort as he or she lay dying, while we waited for a vet. Many sleepless nights have been spent throughout the years caring for sick and injured animals. The depth of love that pours from your very soul can never be measured and the heartache one feels at defeat when attempts are unsuccessful. How can someone look one of these majestic creatures in the eye and pull a trigger. We will never understand the lack of honor and respect! Our quest to save is one of pure love and dedication: to protect and educate humans concerning the plight of all living creatures who think, feel pain and sadness like us and also know right from wrong. Humans don't give animals enough credit for they are perfect in every way, without flaws, unlike we humans. We can only save a handful of these majestic creatures as is with every Sanctuary in the Country. Many will continue to be raised for slaughter as long as ignorant people continue to buy exotic meat. Don't we have enough food to feed the human race in the U.S. without eating carnivores! A man who lives in Neshkora, Wisconsin supply's restaurants with lion meat and has for many years. Only now is there a movement to try and stop him. We have to start somewhere and it's a tiny beginning.

The Sanctuary has received many calls through the years from people "looking" for big cats to "adopt" or "return to the wild". Many pleas come from people telling us how "free" and "happy" they would be in their "new forever home". We have never agreed to place any exotic in our care and we never will. Other Sanctuaries were not so lucky! Burdened with huge feed bills and overwhelming operational expenses, some did place big cats in the hands of these con-artists only to discover they were shipped overseas and ended up in a canned hunt. One such person recognized her beloved lion in a hunting magazine because he had such an unusual head. How can someone be so cold hearted to destroy such a magnificent creature, look into it's eyes in the final moment and feel nothing. Greed, ego and the almighty dollar is what fuels the demise of unfortunate exotics in the hands of these horrible individuals. Through the years we have been targeted and held to different standards by our County and other agencies because we only want to save animals and let them live out there days in dignity. If we had a hunting range in our back acreage, that would be the "appropriate use" of the animals in our care. We fought the system with our belief of a better world and living side by side with sentient beings and we were punished and severely restricted by our County officials. They have never understood why we do what we do and ruled against us when there were no zoning rules on the books 37 years ago. We were

harassed and fined years ago by the DNR for refusing to put our bears and cougars on concrete. Many years, we fought in court and finally reached a settlement with variances and most importantly "NO" concrete. Many sleepless nights, heartaches and tears through the years and we have finally come full circle. I do believe we have finally been somewhat accepted in our County although they still don't understand why we want to save them and not kill them. It is a cruel world we live in, If we had a hundred acres and enough funds for enclosures we could save many more. We can only do what we can with the room we have and make a big difference in a handful of precious lives that will never end up on someone's dinner plate or be exploited in anyway. By supporting Valley of the Kings you have made a huge difference in giving those without a voice, a voice, for the first time in these animals lives. You are standing up for them and letting the world know these animals are very precious and worthy of a long and unexploited life. God Bless you all!

New Arrivals

The State of Wisconsin passed a law June 2010, which outlaws Wolf Hybrids as pets. We have been receiving many calls from owners wanting to relinquish their pets before county officials step in, seize, then euthanize the animal(s). Knight and Magic are two new arrivals. Knight is a 10 year old black hybrid and is the father of Magic. Magic is 7 years old and is also black. They are both imprinted and very sweet animals. The owner could no longer keep them because of the new laws and also lost his house. They are living along side Nadia and both are in need of sponsors.

Our next arrivals are **Cubby** and **Lika**. These two F1 leopard cats are very shy. The owner could no longer keep them and they had been housed in small cages their whole lives. They currently

are with Bruno and Simba but will be moved to the main barn for winter as they are very tiny cats. They also are in need of sponsors.

Angel, a beautiful Wolf Hybrid was picked up at the Fond Du Lac Humane society August 17th. Had we not been able to take her she would have been euthanized that same week. She has only a hint of wolf in her, but because of that miniscule percentage it meant a death sentence for her. The Humane Society took her in as an owner relinquish and then called us. Angel is in need of a sponsor.

Funds to construct new wolf enclosures are needed. The cost of each one is aprox. \$2,500.00. We will be building six new enclosures for more incoming hybrids.
